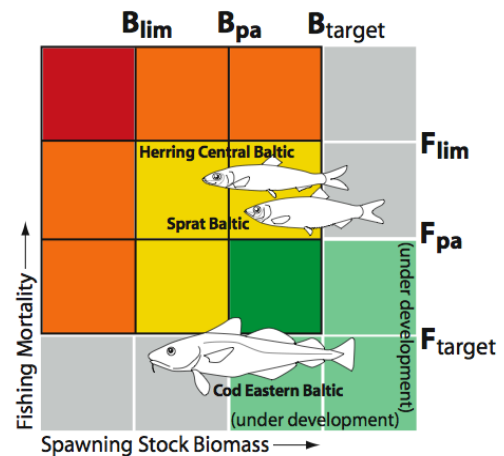
Opening the box: Stock assessment and fisheries advice for stakeholders, NGOs and policy-makers

Objective and level

ICES is well known for providing advice on many different topics regarding marine ecosystems. One of the advice topics deals with advice on fisheries management in the North East Atlantic. While the advisory process has been opened up to external observers since 2006, there is still a need to provide a better insight to the background and methods that are used to underpin the advice. This course is intended to fill that need. The course is directed at policy makers, NGO representatives and fisheries organizations.
